2017 — Anniversaries in Alaska

Alaska is celebrating several anniversaries this year.



The Sesquicentennial - the 150th anniversary of the Treaty of Cession when Alaska passed from Russian to American hands - is in the midst of special events statewide. Particular focus is on Sitka, which is where the transfer took place on October 18, 1867. (See related stories and photos on Page 4.)

Two anniversaries also in store this year deal with the Second World War. The 75th anniversary of the construction of the Alaska Highway, which was built to connect Alaska to the Lower 48 during WWII, is being commemorated with special events in Delta Junction in early June, Anchorage on July 1, and Tok on July 4. For more details about commemoration plans, please contact Meadow Bailey by email at meadow.bailey@alaska.gov, or the local Chambers of Commerce and visitor organizations in Tok, Delta Junction, and Fairbanks.

Also, activities on June 2-4 in Dutch Harbor will recognize the 75th anniversaries of both the WWII bombing of Dutch Harbor by Japan and the evacuation from the Aleutian and Pribilof Islands of the Unangan people, who were resettled in camps in Southeast Alaska. OHA Annual Workshop Highlights

The 2017 Annual Workshop by the state Office of History and Archaeology (OHA) was held in Anchorage on April 4 and was very well attended. Highlights included presentations on the Alaska Heritage Resources Survey (AHRs), the use of districts as management tools, Section 106 mitigation, and the OHA update. Updates to the Alaska Statewide Historic Preservation Plan for 2018-2023 were provided. Friends of Nike Site Summit has announced the tour schedule for 2017

More than 2,000 people have toured Nike Site Summit with Nike veterans and other FONSS volunteers and have seen the restoration work done by FONSS since 2012. This year's tours include a first-time-ever hiking tour on July 8th (see "Save the Date" below for details). All other tours are by 28-passenger bus and require no hiking. All people will need to show identification authorized under the REAL ID Act to gain access to JBER, the military base where Nike Site Summit is located (for more details on REAL ID, please see "About REAL ID" at the bottom of this page). Also, 30-day prior registration is required to comply with JBER security.

The tour will begin at 9:30 am and run until approximately 3:00 pm (please note that the return time is estimated). Admission for this tour is \$25 for adults and \$22 for military and students.

About REAL ID

Starting this summer, under the federal REAL ID Act, all people will be required to present REAL ID-compliant identification in order to gain access to a military base or federal facility in the state of Alaska. Alaska has not yet implemented the REAL ID requirements for state-issued REAL ID identification, but a few alternative forms of identification will be accepted, including a passport or a military ID card. Alaska has just authorized REAL ID for the state, but state-issued forms of REAL ID identification are not expected to be ready before January 2019.
