

To that end, we annually identify ten of the state's most endangered historic properties during National Historic Preservation Week.

We promote communication in support of historic preservation in Alaska and developing a network of preservation supporters.

AAHP educates and informs the public through a quarterly newsletter, workshops, and other means.

We initiate, monitor and support legislation to promote historic preservation in Alaska.

We assist with historic preservation projects across Alaska.

AAHP serves as a liaison between local, statewide and national historic preservation groups.

AAHP is largely funded by membership dues from individuals and organizations. Membership is open to an individual or organization interested in supporting preservation of Alaska's prehistoric and historic resources.

The association is governed by a Board of Directors.
